

Assistant Professor of Counseling

The Division of Counseling and School Psychology at Alfred University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track Assistant Professor of Counseling in our CACREP accredited Counseling program, beginning August 2016. We seek motivated, generous, and self-aware applicants with a good sense of humor, established interpersonal skills, and the potential for excellence in teaching, scholarly activity, and graduate-student advising. The successful candidate will have an established interest in, and a commitment to, shaping the role and identity of the professional counselor, and an interest in expanding programs to reach non-traditional students

Specific duties and responsibilities will include teaching, advising, and supervision of master's level students, with a focus on those enrolled in the School Counseling track. The successful candidate will be responsible for teaching core and specialized courses in both the School Counseling and Clinical Mental Health Counseling tracks. Experience in clinical supervision, especially in school settings, is required.

Qualified applicants will have a doctoral degree in Counselor Education and be appropriately credentialed (or eligible for credentialing) for practice in New York State. ABD candidates will be considered.

Founded in 1836 and nestled between the foothills of the Allegheny Mountains and the Finger Lakes wine region in western New York State, Alfred University is a small comprehensive private university. It is situated on a sprawling 232 acre campus where nearly 2,000 undergraduate and 300 graduate students reside in a vibrant, student-centered learning community. The Division of Counseling and School Psychology offers CACREP accredited graduate programs leading to NYS certification as a School Counselor and NYS Licensure as a Mental Health Counselor. The School Psychology programs offer state and national certification as a School Psychologist and NYS Licensed Psychologist, and are approved by NASP and accredited by APA.
