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**Two *Anticipated* positions in
Clinical Mental Health Counseling
Status: Full-time, to start July 2016**

Antioch University New England invites applications for two full-time Clinical Mental Health Counseling core faculty members to begin in July of 2016. These positions will require teaching master's level clinical mental health counseling courses, online teaching experience, teaching core courses within the Department of Applied Psychology, and supervising practicum and internship students. The Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program is part of the Department of Applied Psychology, also offering master's degree programs in Dance Movement Therapy and Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy (MFT), and Applied Behavior Analysis.

The positions

The positions have responsibilities that include teaching courses in the CACREP accredited Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) program on-campus, as well as teaching online courses. All faculty members are expected to participate fully in the department and program faculty team, advise students, be active in scholarship, and participate in service to the profession (at local, state, national or international levels) as well as to the university. One of the positions will have more of a role in working with our fully online CMHC program. This position will also be an active part of the on-campus program, with a primary focus on teaching, course development and academic advising within the online program.

Educational and Experiential Requirements and Qualifications

An earned doctorate in counselor education (CACREP-accredited program preferred), eligible for licensure as a mental health counselor in New Hampshire, and at least three to five years of professional clinical experience, and graduate teaching experience. A successful candidate must be able to develop and sustain a program of scholarship in counseling or counselor education.

Preferred Qualifications/Areas of Interest

Preferred qualifications include online teaching experience, knowledge of trauma-informed treatment modalities, knowledge in addictive disorders and treatment, research and program evaluation, assessment, career counseling, and knowledge of social justice. Social justice is infused within all aspects of the Antioch programs.

The University, Campus, and Department

Antioch University is a multi-campus, coast-to-coast institution of higher learning that provides learner-centered education to empower students with the knowledge and skills to lead meaningful lives and to advance social, economic, and environmental justice.

Antioch University New England (AUNE), one of Antioch University's (AU's) five campuses, uses a distinctive graduate education pedagogy that mixes rigor with experiential learning and social engagement. AUNE now offers the CMHC CACREP accredited master's program in two platforms. One format offers the program on campus in Keene, NH, with students commuting and attending semester long classes on campus one day a week, with a total of five core courses offered online throughout their program. The other option is a full-time online platform with two required residencies that will occur during the first two years of the program.

The Clinical Mental Health Counseling program is committed to social justice, experiential learning and teaching, clinical training, scholarship, and the use of creative, progressive and applied approaches. As mentioned earlier, our on campus students typically attend classes one day per week, with a few core courses online, to facilitate combining graduate studies with work, internship and family life. AUNE has been educating counselors for over 40 years and has a network of alumni throughout New England (and the country) who serve as many of our field supervisors and employers.
