The Department offers a Masters of Arts in Counseling with a cognate in School Counseling and a cognate in Addictions counseling. In addition, the Department offers an Ed.D. in Curriculum & Instruction with a Counselor Education and Supervision Cognate. Both Masters programs and the Doctoral program are CACREP accredited.

As a faculty member you will have the opportunity to:

- Teach a variety of courses in Counselor Education including doctoral courses in Counselor Education and Supervision
- Conduct research to develop a strong scholarly agenda in the field of Counselor Education as well as apply for grants and contracts
- Participate in service activities including developing community partnerships and holding leadership positions at the State, Regional, and National level

At a minimum you should have:

- An earned doctorate in Counselor Education and Supervision from a CACREP-accredited program, or have been employed as a full-time faculty member in a Counselor Education program for a minimum of one full academic year before July 1, 2013

- Potential and dedication to establishing a highly active research agenda
- Professionalism and collegiality
- License eligible as a professional counselor in Idaho
- Multicultural and social justice advocacy competency

- Experience counseling clients across the lifespan
- Evidence of collaboration/partnerships with other departments, school districts and/or mental health agencies
- Knowledge and experience with developing program resources through contract, grant-writing, and other related activities
- Passion for working with culturally diverse learners and community members
- Enthusiasm and commitment to advising and teaching in doctoral education
- Teaching experience with on-line and other technology driven instruction
- Multilingual fluency
