CLINICAL ASSISTANT PROFESSOR IN COUNSELOR EDUCATION

Location: Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

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The Department of Counseling, Psychology, and Special Education in Duquesne University's School of Education invites applications for a non-tenure track Clinical Assistant Professor position in Counselor Education. Salary and terms of appointment are competitive, including a 12-month salary, vacation, and benefits package.

**Responsibilities** for the Clinical Assistant Professor position include face-to-face teaching in our master's and doctoral counseling programs, providing clinical supervision, and participating in program development and service to the University. The position may entail teaching classes such as Child and Adolescent Counseling, Crisis and Trauma Counseling, Multicultural Counseling, and Career Development, etc.

**Qualifications:** Preferred candidate characteristics include a doctoral degree in Counselor Education from a CACREP-accredited program, experience in either school counseling or clinical mental health counseling, school counseling certification or professional counseling licensure, and a strong professional identity as professional counselor. ABD applicants will be considered and the applicant's doctoral degree will need to be conferred by July 1, 2016.
