

The Counselor Education Program in the Department of Professional Studies at Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne (IPFW) invites applications for a tenure-track position in Counselor Education with a specialization in Couple and Family Counseling at the Assistant Professor level to begin in Fall 2016.

The Counselor Education program offers master's degree specializations in Couple and Family Counseling and School Counseling, and takes a systemic approach to counselor training in both community and school settings. The program has a dedicated small group of faculty members who prioritize a commitment to multiculturalism and social justice, the development of competent and compassionate counselors, and maintaining a collegial work environment based on respect and shared responsibility for programmatic success. The Counselor Education program also operates the IPFW Community Counseling Center, a counseling training clinic that offers free mental health services to the community. IPFW is located in Fort Wayne, Indiana, the second largest metropolitan area in Indiana. It is a thriving community located only 2 hours from Indianapolis and 3 hours from Chicago.

The successful candidate will teach courses in the Counselor Education Program, provide clinical supervision, advise students, pursue a program of research and scholarly activity resulting in publication, and provide service to the university, community, and profession.

**Minimum Requirements:** Earned doctorate in Counselor Education from a CACREP accredited Program, or have a related doctoral degree and have been employed as a full-time faculty member in a counselor education program for a minimum of one full academic year before July 1, 2013.

**Preferred Qualifications:** Training and experience in Marriage and Family Therapy and the ability to obtain a LMFT license in the State of Indiana highly preferred.

Screening will begin November 1<sup>st</sup> and will continue until the position is filled. Applications should include: a cover letter that addresses the candidate's interest in the IPFW Counselor Education program and the specifics outlined in the position announcement, curriculum vita, a 1-2 page statement of teaching philosophy, evidence of teaching effectiveness (sample of student course evaluations, documentation of co-teaching, etc.), three (3) professional letters of reference (including contact information), official transcripts, and copies of counseling licenses or certificates.
