Position in Counselor Education

Background: Portland State University, with an enrollment of approximately 30,000 students, serves the Portland metropolitan area, which is a vibrant and growing community with a culturally diverse population of 1.5 million people. Portland State University's motto is "Let knowledge serve the city", which highlights the campus as a national leader in university–community partnerships. PSU's Graduate School of Education prepares teachers, administrators, and counselors for urban, diverse, and other communities. The Counselor Education Department at PSU provides Master's level preparation in the areas of (a) clinical mental health counseling, (b) marital, couple, and family counseling, (c) clinical rehabilitation counseling, and (d) school counseling. The four counseling programs are CACREP and/or CORE accredited. Strengths of the department include collegial faculty, excellence in teaching, and a model, on-campus Practicum Clinic.

The Counselor Education department is seeking to hire a tenure-track faculty member with background and experience in a CACREP-accredited program who can teach CACREP Common Core and clinical mental health specialty courses. We are most interested in a faculty member with a strong professional identity in mental health counseling. Teaching expertise in Diagnosis and Treatment Planning, as well as Career Counseling, Addiction Counseling, and/or Multicultural Counseling, is highly desirable. Applicants should have a record that shows promise of success in teaching, research, and supervision.

Required Qualifications:

- Earned doctorate from a CACREP-accredited program by time of start date
- Experience/interest in teaching CACREP core courses
- Experience providing counseling supervision
- Experience in multicultural and diverse settings
- Potential for developing a robust scholarly agenda
- Successful completion of a criminal background check

Preferred Qualifications:

- Identification with and preparation in clinical mental health counseling
- Interest in teaching courses such as Diagnosis and Treatment Planning, Career Counseling, Addiction Counseling, Multicultural Counseling,

Research Methodology, Group Counseling, Practicum, and Psychopharmacology

- Strong identity as a researcher in the counseling profession
- Capacity to advise diverse students
- Experience supervising Practicum at an on-campus counseling clinic, or equivalent
- Eligibility for Oregon Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC)

Responsibilities for Position:

- Teach courses in the department's CACREP curriculum
- Advance a scholarly agenda
- Serve as an academic advisor to students in the Clinical Mental Health and Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling Programs
- Serve on University, Graduate School of Education, and Department committees as assigned
- Participate in community outreach, diversity, and partnerships
- Actively collaborate with core faculty on departmental administrative activities

Key Cultural Competencies

- Creates an environment that acknowledges, encourages, and celebrates differences
- Functions and communicates effectively and respectfully within the context of varying beliefs, behaviors, orientations, identities, and cultural backgrounds
- Seeks opportunities to gain experience working and collaborating in diverse, multicultural, and inclusive settings with a willingness to change for continual improvement
