**Non-Tenure Track Faculty Position, Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling
ASSISTANT PROFESSOR**

Background: Portland State University, with an enrollment of approximately 30,000 students, serves the Portland metropolitan area, which is a vibrant and growing community with a culturally diverse population of 1.5 million people. Portland State University's motto is "Let knowledge serve the city", which highlights the campus as a national leader in university-community partnerships. PSU's Graduate School of Education prepares teachers, administrators, and counselors for urban, diverse, and other communities. The Counselor Education Department at PSU provides Master's level preparation in the areas of (a) clinical rehabilitation counseling (b) marital, couple, and family counseling, (c), clinical mental health counseling, and (d) school counseling. The four counseling programs are CACREP and/or CORE accredited. Strengths of the department include collegial faculty, excellence in teaching, and a model, on-campus Practicum Clinic.

The Counselor Education department is seeking to hire a non-tenure-track Clinical Rehabilitation faculty member. We are most interested in candidates who can provide excellent instruction and leadership in the Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling Program. Applicants should have a record that shows promise of success in creative and engaged instruction, scholarship, and supervision.

Required Qualifications:

- Earned doctorate from a CORE accredited program by time of start date
- Experience/interest in teaching CORE courses
- Experience providing counseling supervision to rehabilitation counseling students
- Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC) or eligibility to become a CRC.
- Successful completion of a criminal background check

Preferred Qualifications:

- Identification with and preparation as a rehabilitation counselor or disability-related field.
- Experience providing mental health and/or career counseling to people with disabilities.
- Ability to teach clinical rehabilitation courses such as Foundations of Rehabilitation Counseling, Medical Aspects of Disability, Psychosocial Aspects of Disability, and/or Career Counseling.
- Evidence of a scholarly agenda in the field of rehabilitation counseling.

- Experience or capacity to facilitate CORE/CACREP accreditation, curriculum development, assessment, and program evaluation.
- Experience or capacity to develop/cultivate long-term relationships with various stakeholders, in particular, local, national/state governmental agencies (e.g., Rehabilitation Services Administration, National Institute on Disability, Oregon Board of Licenses Professional Counselors and Therapists, Oregon Office of Vocational Rehabilitation Division).
- Interest in securing grant funding for disability research, training, or technical assistance.
- Capacity to advise diverse students in the Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling Program.
- Eligibility for Oregon licensed professional counselor (LPC).

Responsibilities for Position:

- Teach courses in the department's CORE/CACREP curriculum.
- Serve as an academic advisor to students in the Clinical Rehabilitation counseling program.
- Provide program coordination and leadership as assigned.
- Participate in community outreach and partnerships.
- Serve on University, Graduate School of Education, and Department committees as assigned.
- Actively collaborate with core faculty on departmental administrative activities.

Key Cultural Competencies

- Creates an environment that acknowledges, encourages, and celebrates differences.
- Functions and communicates effectively and respectfully within the context of varying beliefs, behaviors, orientations, identities, and cultural backgrounds.
- Seeks opportunities to gain experience working and collaborating in diverse, multicultural, and inclusive settings with a willingness to change for continual improvement.

We especially encourage applicants from diverse multicultural backgrounds.
