Department of Rehabilitation and Counselor Education Assistant/Associate Professor in Counselor Education Program

Position

The Department of Rehabilitation and Counselor Education at the University of Iowa invites applications for one to two academic year tenure-track faculty positions at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor in the Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling Program, and the Counselor Education doctoral program in the Rehabilitation Counselor Education sub-specialty. Candidates should have an earned doctorate by August 2016.

The successful candidate for the position would begin August 2016. We seek an individual with interests and experience in the field of rehabilitation counseling specific to mental health and rehabilitation counseling services. This individual should have demonstrated:

- a) ability to produce empirically driven and practically relevant research in Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling and Rehabilitation Counselor Education
- b) skills in effective teaching and clinical supervision
- c) commitment to professional service that advances the research, training, and clinical work intended to improve the lives of people with disabilities.

This position requires an earned doctorate in Rehabilitation Counseling, Counselor Education or a related field. Selected candidate must be a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor (CRC) or be CRC eligible. Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) or license eligibility is desired.

The successful candidate will join a research and training partnership with Counselor Education and Supervision, Couples and Family Therapy, School Counseling, and Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling to teach graduate-level courses. The program has strong department, college, university, and clinical community support, and is committed to an environment that values diversity and collegiality. The preferred candidate will have a strong commitment to a scientist-practitioner philosophy, and will be experienced in implementation of CORE and CACREP accreditation standards in rehabilitation and mental health counselor education.

Education Requirement

By August 2016, prospective candidates must have one of the following:

- Earned doctorate in Counseling or a closely related field with a master's degree from a Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) accredited graduate program
- Earned doctorate in Counseling or Counselor Education and Supervision from a Council on Accreditation of Counseling and Related Professions (CACREP) accredited program
- Earned doctorate in Counseling or a closely related field, plus have had employment as a full-time faculty member in a Counselor Education program for a minimum of one full academic year before July 1, 2013.

Required Qualifications

- 1. concentration or specialization in Rehabilitation Counseling, Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Counselor Education
- 2. evidence of potential for scholarly productivity, including publications in recognized counseling, rehabilitation counseling, or related journals
- 3. experience in teaching undergraduate/graduate courses and supervising practica/internships
- 4. potential for attracting external funds
- 5. demonstrated commitment to working collaboratively and with diverse populations
- 6. professional identity as a counselor
- 7. be a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor or be CRC eligible
- 8. commitment to developing and teaching online courses

Desirable Qualifications

- 1. experience teaching in a CACREP and/or CORE accredited graduate program
- 2. experience in the practice of clinical mental health counseling, or rehabilitation counseling
- 3. eligibility for counselor licensure
- 4. experience in obtaining and administering grants
- 5. experience teaching and/or designing online instruction
- 6. experience with applied clinical research

Responsibilities

Duties will include:

- 1. being a core faculty member in the master's Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling program, and the Counselor Education doctoral program in its Rehabilitation Counselor Education sub-specialty
- 2. teaching courses in the Counselor Education, and Rehabilitation Counselor Education sub-specialty doctoral program, and master's program in Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling, in areas consistent with the candidate's interests and department needs
- 3. developing a program of research and publication in an area of specialization
- 4. seeking external funds for research and service
- 5. teaching, advising, and supervising practica/internships of students in Counselor Education and Rehabilitation Counselor Education sub-specialty, and Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling programs at the master's and doctoral levels
- 6. advising doctoral and master's program students in the Counselor Education and Rehabilitation Counselor Education sub-specialty, and Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling programs at the master's and doctoral levels
- 7. supervising doctoral students' dissertations.
