The Department of Counseling, Clinical, and School Psychology (CCSP) invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level with a specialty in clinical psychology to begin July 1, 2016. Responsibilities will include (a) teaching, (b) research and grant-writing, (c) clinical supervision, (d) doctoral student advising, (e) chairing dissertation committees, and (f) university and public service.

We are seeking applicants with statistical and methodological expertise relevant to understanding and advancing evidence-based practices, and assessment in the realms of prevention and intervention for psychological disorders with particular interest in the area of trauma research. Congruent with our department's mission to generate and disseminate knowledge, provide expertise, foster social equity, and prepare the next generation of diverse scholars in applied psychology, we are especially interested in applicants whose work addresses diversity among vulnerable and understudied populations.

The Department is one of two doctoral (Ph.D.) programs accredited by the American Psychological Association for combined scientist-practitioner training in clinical, counseling, and school psychology. We seek applicants who can contribute to the CCSP vision and mission (education.ucsb.edu/ccsp). Preference will be given to applicants with a Ph.D. from an APA-accredited program. It is anticipated that candidates will be license eligible or licensed in the state of California.

Review of applications will begin December 15, 2015, and continue until the position is filled. To apply, please submit a letter of application (including research and teaching interests), curriculum vitae, samples of scholarly work, and samples of teaching evaluations (if available), as well as three letters of reference.
