Minimum Qualifications: 1) Terminal degree by appointment/or application date with specialization in Counselor Education, or Counseling Psychology (if employed in a CACREP program prior to 2013 for one year); and 2) Eligible for appropriate license or certification with in the State of New Mexico.

Preferred Qualification:

- 1) Evidence of expertise in marriage, family, and couple counseling or career counseling;
- 2) Evidence of competence and potential for excellence in teaching and supervising;
- 3) Evidence of developing an active scholarly agenda, with potential for excellence in scholarship and ability to obtain outside funding;
- 4) Evidence of service to the professional counseling profession and community constituents, including experience in collaboration with schools, communities, and agencies;
- 5) Experience supervising and mentoring masters and doctoral students; and
- 6) A demonstrated commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and student success, as well as working with broadly diverse communities.

Responsibilities: The successful candidate will be expected to teach a variety of Master's and Doctoral-level courses in the Counselor Education program. The candidate will be expected to assume an active role in all program activities including accreditation, community outreach, facilitating and maintaining program protocol, advisement, dissertation work, and collaboration with students in scholarly activities. In addition, the candidate will be expected to maintain an active research agenda.

3. Samples of teaching materials and evidence of teaching excellence;
4. Samples of publications/presentations;
5. The names, address, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses for three references;

7. Letter of Interest
