## VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

**JOB TITLE:** Assistant or Associate Professor – Clinical Mental Health Counseling

### JOB DETAILS

A tenure track, full-time, academic year faculty position is available with an **anticipated position start date as early as May 2016 and no later than August 2016** in the CACREP accredited Clinical Mental Health Counseling graduate program within the Department of Rehabilitation and Counseling. The appointment will be at the assistant or associate professor level. Summer teaching is expected.

### QUALIFICATIONS

#### Required

- An earned doctoral degree in counselor education OR full-time faculty member in a counselor education program for a minimum of one full academic year before July 1, 2013. Consideration will be given to candidates who are ABD, although doctorate must be completed within one year of the contract start date.

#### Preferred

- Degree from a CACREP-accredited program.
- Two years of employment in addition to clinical practicums and internships in the mental health counseling field.
- Successful graduate teaching and supervisory experience in addictions, counseling children and adolescents, counseling theories and counselor skill development.
- A record of professional and scholarly productivity.

### RESPONSIBILITIES

The Department of Rehabilitation and Counseling is characterized by committed student-centered professionals who value teaching in a collaborative and participatory work environment. The successful applicant is expected to teach primarily graduate courses, including supervision of practicum and internships. A full-time teaching load for a faculty member is 12 credits per semester. Summer teaching is expected. Faculty members use a variety of instructional technology including blended and distance learning applications. The teaching assignment will depend on department needs and the expertise of the new faculty member. The position will serve graduate students in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy, School Psychology, School Counseling (K-12), and Rehabilitation Counseling. Faculty members are expected to participate in faculty governance, curriculum development, recruitment, student advisement, scholarly research, and professional service activities.

### CAMPUS INFORMATION

A member of the University of Wisconsin System, UW-Stout serves approximately 9,300 students in 25 graduate and 45 undergraduate programs and one doctoral program. UW-Stout is a 2001 Baldrige Award Recipient, supporting a progressive, learning-centered, quality-based educational environment that is focused on continuous improvement.
