ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF COUNSELING
SPECIALIZATION: SCHOOL COUNSELING**

The Department of Counseling, Rehabilitation Counseling, and Counseling Psychology at West Virginia University invites applications for an academic year, tenure track, benefits-eligible faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor to begin on August 16, 2016. The appointee will serve as a core faculty member in the department's CACREP accredited M.A. program in Counseling. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Responsibilities include teaching, research, and service.

The Counseling Program is located within the College of Education and Human Services, is nationally accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs and is part of a comprehensive department that also includes a master's level program in Clinical Rehabilitation & Mental Health Counseling and a doctoral program in Counseling Psychology. The MA in Counseling offers a focus in school counseling as well as clinical mental health counseling.

Qualifications: A qualified applicant must have:

1. Completed a doctorate in counseling/counselor education with a school counseling emphasis.
2. Familiarity with the ASCA National Model and show evidence of working with and/or teaching the model.
3. Two or more years of experience as a professional school counselor.
4. Research and scholarly activities commensurate with assistant professor rank, which includes identified focus areas in school counseling.
5. Experience teaching school counseling and other graduate courses.
6. Experience providing clinical supervision to school counselors.
7. Experience providing leadership and service to the school counseling field.

Responsibilities include the following:

1. Provide instruction in the school counseling courses (Orientation to School Counseling, Practicum, and Internship).

2. Provide instruction in courses for both school and clinical mental health students. Possible courses may include: Counseling Techniques; Counseling Theories; Counseling Children, Adolescents, and Parents; Testing; Career Counseling; Human Development; and Couples and Family Counseling.
3. Undertake a productive research and publication agenda.
4. Undertake service responsibilities to the department, college, university and state.
